In order to maintain an high level of quality horse care, the trainers need to have a good working relationship with your horse's farrier. We recommend Pierre Pacquelier. Part of our job as your trainer is to schedule and oversee farrier visits and to relay any concerns or needs that you may have for your horse. Farriers need to be aware of any behavioral issues, lameness concerns or corrective shoeing. We provide a 3-way line of communication between you, the farrier, and the staff. Horses coming due will be listed on the shoeing board at least one week prior to the date they will be shod. Payment is due on the day the horse is to be shod. Please leave a blank check on the shoeing board payable to Pierre Pacquelier. He will complete the amount. His late fee is \$25. Any horse that needs to be held by staff during shoeing will be charged a \$25/per hour handling fee.

Ridgemark farm uses Dr. Natalie Broomhall at One Woman Vet Service and Steinbeck County Equine Clinic as our veterinarians. Boarders with horses in full training will not be charged a handling fee for as long as the vet appt. is made by the trainers and conducted during regular business hours. Handling by trainers for any emergency calls to any vet during non-business hours will be billed at \$25/ hour. Horses that need to medicated or handled by trainers on non training days will be charged \$25/hr. In an emergency situation, every attempt will be made to contact the owner's preferred vet. If that vet cannot be reached in a reasonable amount of time, management reserves the right to contact vet of our choice.

Shots and worming clinics will be conducted twice yearly. The owner will be directly billed by Natalie Broomhall for materials and services rendered. The vet will check your horse's sheath and clean it if necessary. They will also check your horse's teeth-management will make a seperate appointment with the equine dentist if your horses needs dental work.

Consent to Treatment:

In the event that my horse is injured or becomes ill and I cannot be reached, I hereby consent to emergency medical care for my horse in the best judgement of a licensed veterinary professional until such time that I can be reached and consulted, provided the estimated cost of the treatment does not exceed: \$_____. This consent DOES/DOES NOT include euthanasia if in the judgement of the treating veterinarian that is the only humane treatment and my horse has little or no prospect for recovery.
